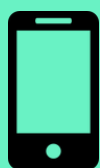
Mental Health Awareness Week

SEND and AP Change Programme Evaluation

We recently contacted you about a follow-up survey being completed as part of the SEND and AP Change Programme evaluation. The Department for Education (DfE) has commissioned BMG to carry out an independent follow-up survey to understand the experiences and views of education settings in local areas participating in the SEND and AP Change Programme. The evaluation is being carried out by three organisations: ICF, BMG and Fortia Insight. Some settings may have taken part in a similar survey last year. This follow-up survey is an opportunity to share your updated experiences over the past 12 months, including any changes in inclusive practice, access to support, and partnership working.

Swindon's Assistive Technology Lending Library

Swindon's Assistive Technology Lending Library is an exciting pilot project designed to provide children and young people with SEND access to a range of technologies that support and enhance learning. The next trial will run from the 18th of May until the 8th/16th of July, giving schools throughout Swindon the opportunity to explore assistive technology through a 'try before you buy approach'.

Schools can borrow a range of equipment including: laptops, iPads, reader pens, visualisers, headphones and specialist equipment such as Dragon dictation and Read & Write. The technology focuses on improving reading and writing skills.

Evidence from the Assistive Technology Test and Learn evaluation (IFF Research, Department for Education, September 2024) indicates that the use of assistive technology in schools has positive benefits for pupils with SEND.

They are designed to be supportive, practical and accessible.

This session explores why regular school attendance is important and the common causes of emotional-based school avoidance. The session will also cover practical strategies to support your child.
